

DUNNE, PATRICK H.

Born at _____ Maine, _____ 18__ (about 1824).

Son of _____ and _____.

Married, Louisa Burton, daughter of Don Luis Burton, at Santa Barbara, California, in 1852; children, John, James and Hugh.

Listed, U. S. Census, 1860, at Tucson, age 36, born in Maine, occupation - Printer, property valued at \$3, 500; the Los Angeles Southern News of October 3, 1860, printed the following:

We learn from Tucson that a difficulty . recently occurred in that place between Col. J. W. Robinson and Patrick H. Dunn, in which the latter was dangerously, and it is feared mortally wounded by a pistol shot, fired by the former.

Member from Tucson in the 1st. District, 1st. Territorial Council at Prescott, 1864; elected from Pima County to the 2d. Territorial Council in 1865, but did not attend the session; appointed by Governor Goodwin on December 1, 1865, to be Probate Judge of Pima County and served until his death.

Died at Tucson, A. T., May 6, 1866; his estate consisted in a half interest in a house and lot on Main Street In Tucson, a saddle, bridle, spurs, pistol and belt, the proceeds of which, when sold, amounted to \$965, which was sent to Mrs. Dunne.
