Married, Teodora Alarcon at San Elizario, Texas, September 18, 1870.

Came to Arizona as Private, Company A, 1st California Cavalry, 1862;
promoted Corporal on August 31, for gallant conduct in action with
Apaches near Black River, Arizona, March 27, 1863.

Killed by a mob at San Elizario, El Paso County, Texas, December 11, 1877

Buried in the back yard of his home in San Elizario, Texas.
