

# GEMMIL, JOHN M.

GEMMEL, JOHN-M. , born in Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania

1824; probably a son of John Gemmil, who was of Scotch descent; enrolled September 3, at Cincinnati, and mustered in September 4, 1847, at Camp Wood, near Cincinnati, Ohio, to serve during the war with Mexico, as Private, Captain J.E. Harle's Company G, 2d Ohio Infantry (Irvin's); honorably discharged at Cincinnati, July 26, 1848; Enrolled November 12, at Murphys, Calaveras County, California, and mustered in at San Francisco to serve 3 years as Private, Captain Hiram A. Messinger's Company E, 7th California Infantry; occupation when enlisted, Miner; stationed at the Presidio of San Francisco until March, 1865; when he went with the Company by sea to San Pedro, California; marched from San Pedro to Tubac, A.T., and stationed there until September, 1865; moved with the Company to Fort Mason, near Calabasas, Pima County, A.T., where he died of disease on December 2, 1865, aged 41.

John M. Gemmel (not borne as Gemmil) was enrolled September 3, 1847 at Cincinnati, Ohio and mustered into service September 4, 1847 at Camp Wood near Cincinnati, Ohio as a private in Captain Harle's Company (G) 2d Ohio Infantry to serve during the war with Mexico. (This was Colonel Irvin's Regiment)

He was mustered out and honorably discharged the service July 26, 1848 at Cincinnati, Ohio as a private. A g e 23

John M Gemmil was enrolled November 12, 1864 at Murphys, California and mustered into service November 28, 1864 at San Francisco, as a private in Company E, 7th California Infantry to serve three years. He died December 2, 1865 at Fort Mason, A. T. as a private.

He was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, was 35 years old at date of enlistment and by occupation a miner.
