JAY, LEROY

Born at Tioga, Tioga County, Pennsylvania, \_\_\_\_\_, 18\_\_ (about 1832)

Son of \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_; (never married).

Enrolled at La Porte, Plumas County, California, August 16, and  
mustered in at Camp Downey, Oakland, California, August 30, 1861, to serve  
3 years as Private, Company F, 1st California Infantry; left Fort Yuma, May  
15, 1862, and marched with the Company via Fort Barrett, Tucson and Apache  
Pass, arriving at Mesilla on the Rio Grande August 15; stationed at Fort  
Craig, N.M., until October, 1863; marched from there via Fort Wingate and  
the Little Colorado Valley to Fort Whipple, A.T., arriving in December, 1863.

Listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, 3d District (Yavapai County),  
A.T., age 32, born in Pennsylvania, occupation - Soldier; honorably discharged  
at Fort Whipple, A.T., August 29, 1864; ambushed and killed by Apaches between  
Big Bug and Turkey Creek, Yavapai County, A.T., on November 8, 1866, with  
William Trahern and L.M. Linton while they were escorting a wagon-load of  
provisions to the Bully Bueno mining camp.
