JOHNS, WILLIAM BROOKE

Born at Georgetown, District of Columbia, June \_\_, 1818.

Appointed to West Point, 1836; graduated, 1840; stationed at Fort  
Bliss, Texas, 1850-51, and in New Mexico, 1850-60; as Captain, 3d  
U.S. Infantry, participated in expedition against Tuni-cha Navajo  
Indians, 1859, and in defense of Fort Defiance, April 30, 1860.

Dropped from the Army April 11, 1861, but did not join the Rebellion.

Died at Georgetown, D.C., October 18, 1894, aged 76.
