LANSDALE, LEWIS, born in Highland County, Ohio, 1829; probably a son of Whittington Lansdale of that County; enrolled November 5 at Dutch Flat, Placer County, California, and mustered in at the Presidio of San Francisco, November 16, 1864, to serve 3 years in Captain Martin H. Calderwood's Company D, 7th California Infantry; occupation when enlisted, Lumberman; left San Francisco by sea in March, 1865, for San Pedro, California; left Drum Barracks, near San Pedro, April 4 and marched to Fort Yuma arriving April 19; left Fort Yuma April 21, arrived at Gila Bend April 30 and at Tubac, A.T., in May, 1865; stationed there until September when the company was moved to Fort Mason (Calabasas); died of disease at Fort Mason, Pima County, A.T., January 4, 1866, aged 30.

LANSDALE, Lewis Private, Co. D, 7th California Infantry

Lewis Lansdale was enrolled November 5, 1864 at Dutch Flat, California and mustered into service November 16, 1864 at San Francisco, California as a private in Company D, 7th California Infantry to serve three years.

He died January 4, 1866 at Fort Mason, Arizona Territory of disease.

He was born in Highland County, Ohio, was 35 years old at date of enlistment, and by occupation a lumberman.
