Came to Arizona as Private, Company B, 2d California Cavalry, 1862.

Listed, Barter's Tucson Directory, 1881, Real Estate dealer; agent for the Wells-Fargo Express Company at Tucson, 1884; Member, Society of Arizona Pioneers and of Negley Post No. 1, G. A. R., Tucson; Postmaster at Mohawk, Yuma County, A. T., from April 28, 1893 to August 22, 1895, Secretary, Mohawk Canal Company, 1893.

Member, Tuolumme Lodge No. 8, F & A. M., Sonora, California.

Admitted from Yuma, A. T., to U. S. Soldiers' Home, Sawtelle, California, April 25, 1895, where he died on December 1, 1899, aged 60.

Buried, Soldiers' Home Cemetery, Los Angeles County, California.
