Came from San Bernardino, California to Arizona, 1863; listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, 3d District (Yavapai County), age 37, born in New York, resident in Arizona 8 months, occupation, Driver, property valued at \$1,125; elected Recorder, Wickenburg Mining District, May 21, 1864; in charge of Sutler's store at Camp McDowell, 1865-66, and at Camp Reno, on Tonto Creek 1867-69; listed, U. S. Census, July 21, 1870, at Maricopa Wells, A. T., age 42, born in New York, wife and six children, occupation, Retail Merchant, property valued at \$23,000; appointed Postmaster at Maricopa Wells, June \_\_, 1870 and served until \_\_\_\_\_, 18\_\_, moved to Silver King, A. T., 1878.

Died at San Francisco, California, July 18, 1883, aged \_\_\_\_.

Buried, Laurel Hill Cemetery, San Francisco, California.
