PALMER, HORATIO BRADSHAW, born at Farmersville, Leeds County, Canada West (Ontario), November 28, 1830; son of _____ and _____; married Margarita _____ at _____ on _____ % -; children, Abram B. (a member of the A.P.H.S.); _____.

First came to Arizona in 1858; listed Territorial Census, April, 1864, at Tucson, occupation, Mechanic, resident in Arizona 18 months, property valued at \$200; Tucson City Directory, 1881, occupation, Carriage Maker; joined the Society of Arizona Pioneers, February 7, 1888, occupation, Wagon-maker at Tucson; his obituary in the Tucson Citizen states that:

He first came to Arizona in 1856, with the Overland Stage company. Shortly thereafter he went to Virginia City, California, where he established a lucrative wagon-making business; after being burned out twice he cast his lot in San Luis Obispo, same State, where he held the office of County Treasurer for two consecutive terms.

He returned here in 1880 and had resided in this city continuously until the day of his death.

Died at his home, 307 Convent Street, Tucson, Arizona, on April 18, 1913, aged 83; buried _____ Cemetary,
