Came to Arizona with the Overland Stage Co., 1857; Listed, Territorial

Census, April, 1864, at Tucson, A.T., age 33, born in South Carolina,

single, occupation, Miner, resident in Arizona 7 years; U.S. Census,

August, 1870, at Salt River Valley, A.T., age 40, born in South Carolina,

occupation, Farmer.

Died in the <sup>Yuma County Jail then used as the</sup> Territorial Prison, Yuma, A.T., August 13, 1878, aged 47.

Buried in the town Cemetery, Yuma, Ariz.
