TWADDLE, HARVEY

Listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, 3d District (Yavapai County)

age 27, born in Indiana, resident in Arizona 4 months, occupation,

Miner, property valued at \$75. Was a member of the Second Woolsey

Expedition against the Apaches, March 29 to April 17, 1864. Wounded

by Apaches July 27 and died at Walnut Grove, Yavapai County, A. T.,

August 5, 1867. Patrick Hamilton makes this reference to him:

"Harvey Twaddle, a pioneer prospector, was waylaid on on a trail in Walnut Grove and shot in the heart, but drove the Indians off who attacked him. Assistance arriving shortly he was carried home and lived eight days. A post-mortem examination showed the bullet imbedded in his heart half an inch from its lower point. This is one of the most extraordinary instances of vitality on record."
