

WALKER , THOMAS WOODRUFF

Born at New Albany, Floyd County, Indiana, June 16, 1833.

Son of Thomas B. and Mary (Woodruff) Walker.

Married, Henrietta C. Dayton at Newark, N.J., April 1, 1863.

Children, Marie Woodruff (Mrs. \_\_\_\_\_)

Came to Fort Defiance, New Mexico, as 2d Lieutenant, 3d U.S. Infantry, 1856, and stationed there until 1861; participated in several conflicts with the Navajo Indians.

Retired as Captain, 3d U.S. Infantry, September 11, 1863.

Died at Norwalk or at South Wilton, Fairfield Co., Connecticut, December 9, 1890, aged 57.
