In command of the schooner Invincible which brought Lieutenant George H. Derby to the mouth of the Colorado River, December 23, 1850, and thence upstream about 25 miles; joined with George A. Johnson and Benjamin Hartshorn in establishing the Colorado Steam Navigation Company in 1853, which by 1868 had 5 steamboats and 5 barges on the river; E. D. Tuttle says that these three men retired and went to live on their estates near San Diego; recommended by C. D. Poston for appointment as Agent for the Cocopah Indians, January 1, 1864.

Died at San Francisco, California on August 5, 1883
