Residence Hall Safe Tips:

Always lock your doors even if you are just going down the hall or next door for a few minutes.

If you see someone or something suspicious, call the ASU Police Department immediately to report it.

Never leave external doors propped open. If you find a propped open door, close it!

Always use the 'buddy system' when walking outside after dark.

Activate SafeWalk so friends or family members can view your step-by-step progress on a map. Chat live with your designated emergency contacts during your trip. Deactivate Safewalk once you arrive safely.

Friends and family can also virtually walk an app user home. The app's Safe-Walk feature uses GPS-tagged monitoring to track an app user's progress on a Web-based map. Once a user has reached his or her destination safely, the feature easily can be deactivated.

As a part of Live Safe app, you can activate SafeWalk so friends and family can monitor your progress on a map and you can chat live with designated emergency contacts as you walk. Deactivate Safewalk once you arrive safely.
