Residence Hall Safe Tips:

Always lock your doors even if you are just going down the hall or next door for a few minutes.

If you see someone or something suspicious, call the ASU Police Department immediately to report it.

Never leave external doors propped open. If you find a propped open door, close it!

Always use the 'buddy system' when walking outside after dark.

Activate SafeWalk so friends or family members can view your step-by-step progress on a map. Chat live with your designated emergency contacts during your trip. Deactivate Safewalk once you arrive safely.

Friends and family can also virtually walk an app user home. The app's Safe-Walk feature uses GPS-tagged monitoring to track an app user's progress on a Web-based map. Once a user has reached his or her destination safely, the feature easily can be deactivated.

As a part of Live Safe app, you can activate SafeWalk so friends and family can monitor your progress on a map and you can chat live with designated emergency contacts as you walk. Deactivate Safewalk once you arrive safely.

Residential Hall Burglaries at San Pablo

Since October 11th there have been three residential burglaries at San Pablo. The burglaries have occurred on a Friday and Saturday between 4:15pm to 10:30pm. In two of the cases it was reported a black male, in his 30's, approximately 5'7", 200 lbs was seen leaving the burglarized residence. The suspect on one occasion identified himself as "Adam Johnson" when confronted. The suspect gains entry by unlocked doors and rummages through the residence looking for objects which are easily concealable such as a laptops, wallets, or jewelry.

ASU Police Department asks you to lock your doors when leaving your dorm and to notify ASU Police if you see any suspicious activities.
